The Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation Stamp

Annually, through the Federal Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation [Duck] Stamp, about \$24 million is collected and spent on securing wetland and grassland habitats.

The story of the stamp is a great one. Since 1934, the sales of Federal Duck Stamps have generated more than \$900 million, which has been used to purchase or lease over 5.5 million acres of waterfowl and wetland habitats in the National Wildlife Refuge System. **Ninety-eight cents of every dollar goes to land acquisition and immediately related costs.**

The National Wildlife Refuge System is America's best kept secret, under-appreciated and underfunded. This system of protected lands covers over 560 National Wildlife Refuges (NWRs) and over 200 Waterfowl Production Areas (WPAs). Of these, 252 NWRs have been created, in part or in whole, through Stamp dollars, and close to 99% of all WPAs have been secured through Stamp dollars. These include refuges from East to West: Monomoy (MA), Okefenokee (GA), Ottawa (OH), Horicon (WI), Santa Ana (TX), Quivira (KS), Bosque del Apache (NM), Sacramento (CA), and Nisgually (WA).

Many refuges across the Lower 48 have been acquired with Stamp funds. Visit our website for a map of these refuges. You can look up what percentage of any refuge was acquired with the help of Stamp funds.

Your purchase supports a tradition of wildlife art. Since 1949, the design of each year's Duck Stamp has been chosen in an open art contest.
